The History of Huntington Park and surrounding areas – Part 6

Albert Edward Cryer and Christina Cryer moved into the district in the late 19th century. they leased a 60 acre property in the Cryers Rd area and called it "Te Wharau" meaning "temporary shelter" They bought this in approximately 1898. Prior to her marriage Christina was raised in a house near what is now the cricket pavilion in Bells Road, Lloyd Ellsmore Park Pakuranga. Albert and Christina had five children, Connie, Jack, Roy, Ena and Lorna Jean. Jack and Roy followed their parents in farming the property. Jack married Jane Stewart and they had two sons, Elwyn Stewart and John Maxwell. Elwyn continued the farming tradition and Max, who trained as a teacher became well known nationally for his music, radio and television work. A quarry was established on the farm near where the hardware house building stands today in Te Rakau Drive. Basalt from this quarry was used for curbstones in Auckland.
