Transport Updates are attached and some below:

EAST AUCKLAND TRANSPORT UPDATE

The Eastern Busway project continues to make significant progress, with Auckland Transport advising that 2026 is the final full year of construction before the busway opens in 2027. This major investment will provide faster, more reliable public transport connections across East Auckland, alongside safer walking and cycling links.

What's happening over July and August?

Continued construction new busway stations and public spaces

Underground utility upgrades and road layout changes

New planting and landscaping across the corridor

Cycleway and footpath improvements

Intersection upgrades and safety improvements

Key impacts to be aware of:

Lane reductions and layout changes on Pakūrangā Road and Tī Rākau Drive

Temporary road closures and detours in some locations

Some overnight works (9pm–5am), weekend works, and school holiday works

Footpath and cycleway closures in selected areas while upgrades are completed

Some of the larger projects include:

Pakūrangā Library intersection upgrades (July–November)

Huntington Drive intersection improvements (approximately 5 months)

Ongoing works between Greenmount Drive and Te Koha Road

Busway construction at Burswood Drive and Tī Rākau Drive

While construction can be frustrating at times, it is encouraging to see visible progress across the corridor as we move closer to delivering a modern rapid transit network for East Auckland.

Please allow extra travel time, follow detour signage, and take care around work sites.
